I am looking forward to working with you in the total program at Jackson Academy as it continues to expand and to achieve its goal of "Excellence in Education."

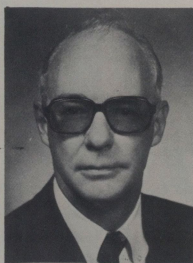

Looking Back — Moving Forward

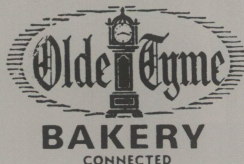
With the opening of the 1981-1982 term, Jackson Academy reaches a new milestone in its recognized history of dedication to maintaining the finest learning environment for its students. For the first time Jackson Academy offers a full program of service for primer through twelfth grade. Both the physical facilities and the academic curriculum reflect this growth and expansion.

A progressive building program gives proof of the continued response to academic and extracurricular demands. Bearing faint resemblance to the original building site, the present campus includes fifty-nine classroom units, five offices, two libraries, a multipurpose activities building, cafeteria, and football, baseball, and practice fields. Most recent construction has furnished eight classrooms, two science labs, a kitchen and cafeteria, and an elementary library.

Following the principles of academic quality on which it was established, Jackson Academy strives to develop the fullest potential of its student community with a diverse and enriched curriculum. At its founding in 1959 as a more individualized approach to learning, the school served forty students with a faculty of six. Today the academy encompasses a preschool, elementary school, junior high school, and senior high school with a total enrollment of 1090 and a faculty and staff of eighty-eight.

Jackson Academy's academic strength lies in elementary instruction in basic skills with supportive services and enrichment programs. As curriculum advances greater diversification of subject matter is offered in the arts, sciences, and professional skills. A comprehensive athletic program provides skill supervision and training in football, basketball, baseball, soccer, track, tennis, and swimming. Opportunities for team participation and individual achievement are highlighted with interscholastic competition.

With a deep sense of respect for past ideals, a realistic awareness of present needs, and a purposeful anticipation of future expectations, Jackson Academy accepts the challenge of excellence in education.

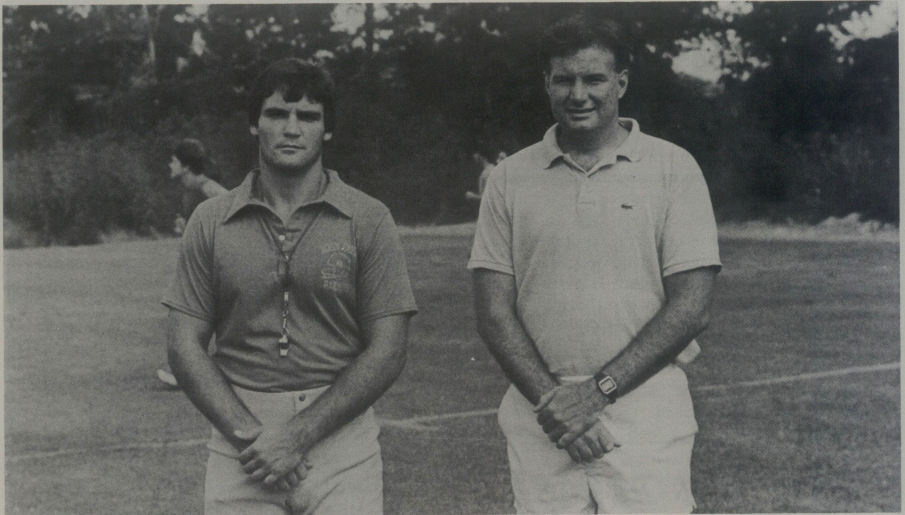
Jackson Academy Athletic Directors

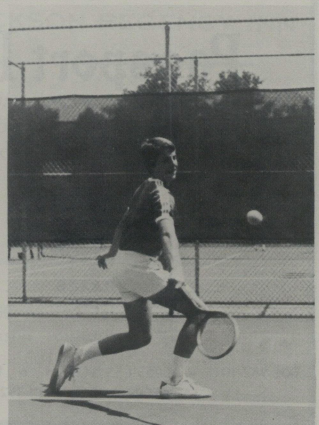

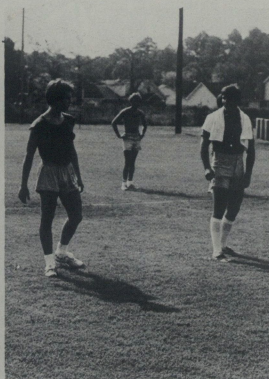

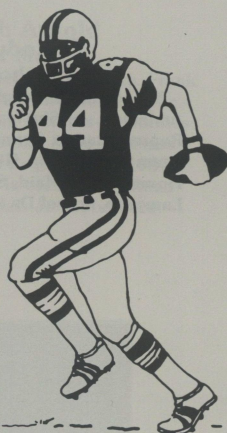
Jr. High Raiders To Field Young Team In '81

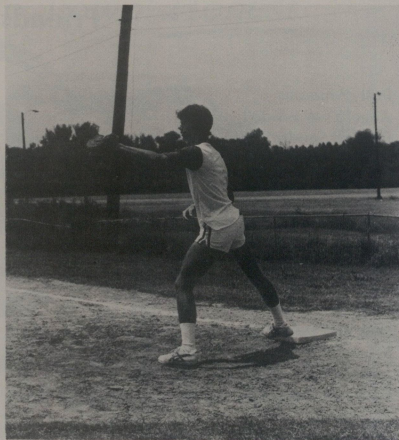
