

Dantone to Guide Raider Athletic Program into AAA Competition

The 1982 - 1983 school year represents a milestone in the athletic program at Jackson Academy. J. A. has been elevated in athletics from A classification to that of AAA classification. This year J. A. has been placed in the North Division of the state-wide AAA Academy Conference. This jump represents a tremendous leap in the progress of the athletic programs at the school and presents a great challenge to our student athletes and their coaches.

The man who will be guiding the athletic programs this year as the Athletic Director is Sammy Dantone, Jr. Sammy graduated from high school in 1959, in Greenwood, Mississippi, went on to Mississippi State University, and obtained a Master's Degree from Delta State University.

While at Mississippi State, Sammy played football for the Bulldogs and was named SEC Back of the Week. After leaving college, Sammy coached basketball at Greenwood High School for five years. During that time his record was 108 wins against only 37 losses, and his team won the North Big Eight Basketball Title twice.

After leaving Greenwood High School, Sammy became Athletic Director, Head Basketball Coach, and Head Football Coach at Pillow Academy in Greenwood. While there, Sammy's football teams posted a record of 70 wins against only 30 losses.

In 1979, Coach Dantone moved to Brandon Academy where he served as Headmaster, Athletic Director, Head Football Coach and Head Basketball Coach. During his tenure at Brandon, Sammy's football teams recorded 23 wins against 8 losses and won the State AA Football Championship in 1979. In that same year, Sammy Dantone was named the South Central AA Football Coach of the Year.





In addition to his coaching duties at the various schools, Sammy was named as Coach of the North All Star Basketball Team in 1971 and 1979, and was named as Coach of the North All Star Football Team in 1975. He was also the Coach of the South All Star Football Team in 1979.

Sammy Dantone has proven himself as being a capable coach and Athletic Director, and is the type of individual Jackson Academy needs and must have to guide its athletic programs during the first year in AAA sports.

the addition of several runners from the seventh grade team, this spring looks bright for boys' jr. high track.


