I believe that Jackson Academy has and will continue to promote the kind of programs in which students will be proud to participate, and that you will be proud to support.

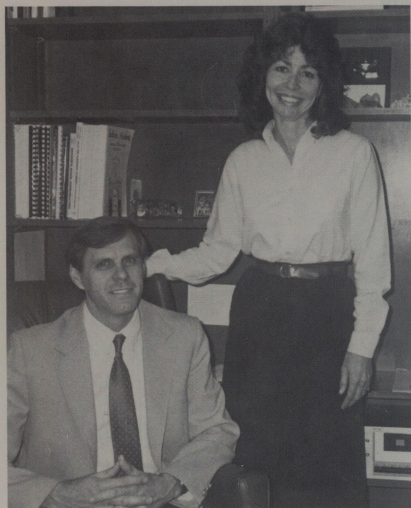

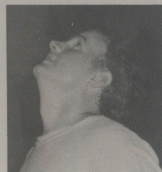
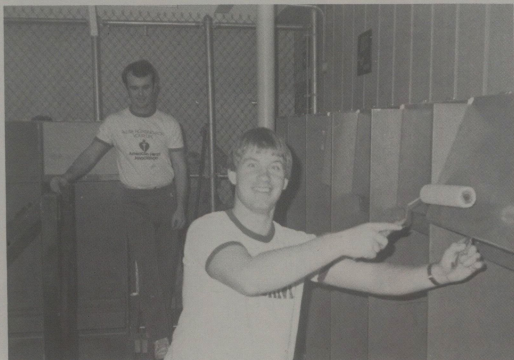
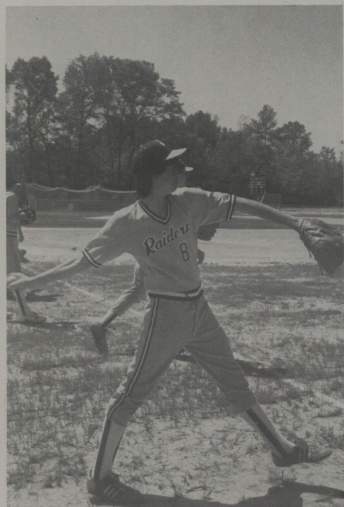
The Ray Higgins and Harmon "Bubba" Cox Awards

VARSITY RAIDERS SPEND FIRST WEEK OF PRACTICE AT HOLMES COUNTY STATE PARK

July 31st was just another hot Sunday in the summer to most of the students of Jackson Academy but for the members of the varsity Raider football team it was the ending of the summer. It was time to start those dreaded two-a-day workouts in preparation of the upcoming football season. The first week of two-a-day practices is always spent in shorts and helmets with emphasis put on learning plays, blocking assignments and physical conditioning. In previous years the practices were held at the school in the mornings and in the afternoons but this year the Raiders were taking a different approach.

Coach Dantone knew that the approaching season was going to be a tough one and he knew that there was much work to be done due to the fact that over half of the team was going to be playing varsity football at J. A. for the first time. A decision was made to take the team off to Holmes County State Park for the first week. This would accomplish two things. First, the team needed to think and act as a single unit and develop a sense of togetherness. A week away from home together should help in this respect.

The first night at camp the boys wanted to stay up and talk but they soon learned that the camp was not a social outing. The coaches had much they wanted to teach the team and all practices were tough. After the first day it seemed all of the boys spent most of their free time resting and catching up on sleep.

The food at the camp must have been good because when the team returned to the school on the following Friday it was learned that most of them had gained weight. The coaches agreed that because of the camp much was accomplished and all will be more prepared to start practice the following week at the school in full pads.

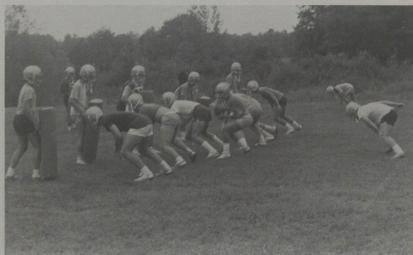

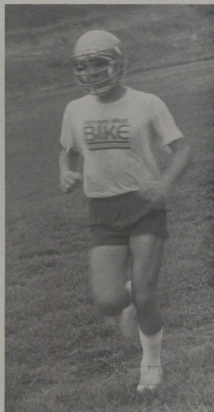

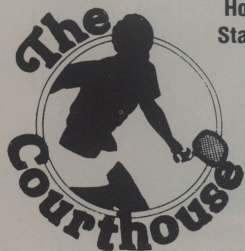
JACKSON ACADEMY STATE CHAMPIONSHIP SWIM TEAM

A Good Year To Watch 'Em

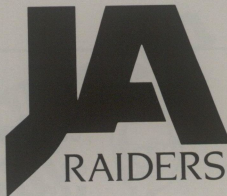

Girl's Cross Country

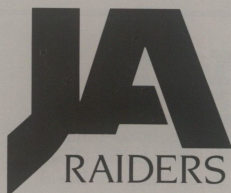




Jackson Academy Golf — 1983-84
