

Jackson Academy 26 Years of Service



This was the sixth straight championship for our swimmers. Our other teams represented our school well by being competitive and displaying good sportsmanship.



I believe that Jackson Academy has and will continue to promote the kind of programs in which students will be proud to participate, and that you will be proud to support.





The Varsity Raidets Should Be Greatly Improved In 1984

The 1984 football season will certainly be another tremendous task for the Raiders. This will be the third year for the Jackson Academy Raiders to participate in the tough North AAA action.

This year's squad will hopefully have 35 participants vying for positions on the squad, a long way from the 16 hopefuls that were out two years ago.

The team will be bolstered by two back to back undefeated Jr. High teams coming up. The squad will be made up of 17 sophomores off of this years Jr. High team, 14 juniors and only 7 seniors. Last year's team consisted mostly of underclassmen with 7 starters returning on offense and 6 on defense. Injuries to key personnel at one time or another helped lead to a mediocre record of 3-7 in the tough North AAA. The team's strength this year will be at te skilled positions where we have lettermen returning at the important positions of quarterback, running backs, and wide receivers.

Weaknesses are in the line where we need more depth and size. Returning starters on offense are Chris Lawrence QB, David Adams from tackle to FB, tailbacks Scott Coker, Phil Buteau, and Powell Swearengen shaking off an injured knee. Wing backs are David Dantone, and Stacy Phillips. Split ends are Kenny Avery and Alex Belmont. At right guard we have Scooter Purnell. At left tackle is David Tibbs, and at right tackle is Mike Coleman. The rover is Keith Parker.

Jr. High Boys' Basketball


