It is always a pleasure for me to welcome Jackson Academy fans and fans of the visiting team to our campus to enjoy good athletic competition.



One of the best ways for us to show everyone that we desire excellence in education is by our conduct at games and by the place athletics holds in our total program.

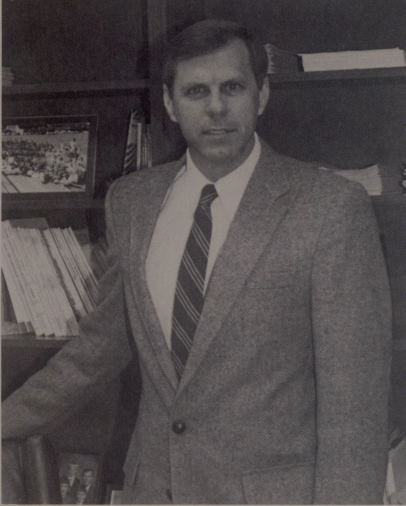

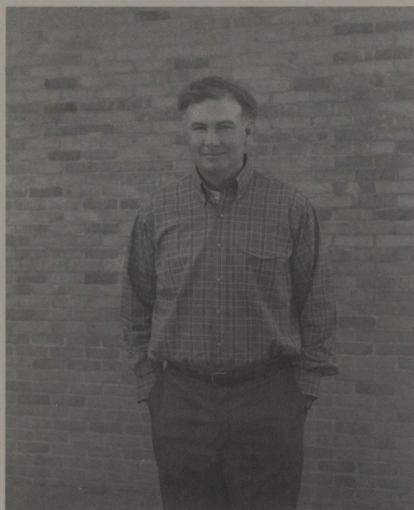

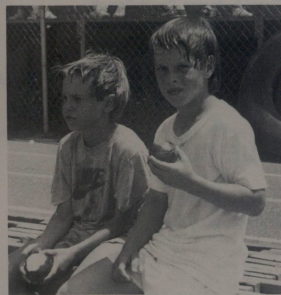


