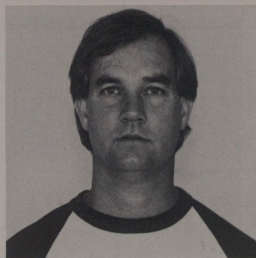




Jr. High Football

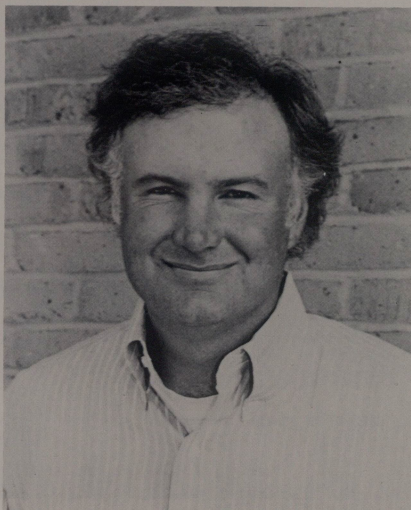
Varsity Girls Track

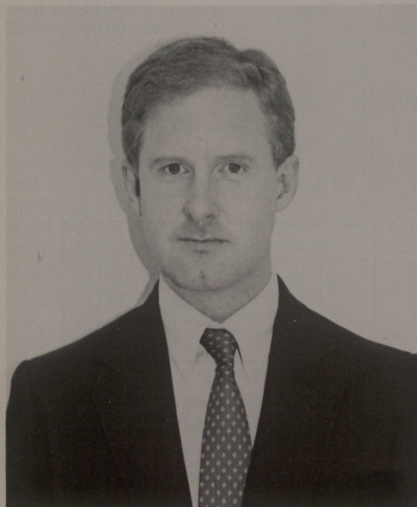
