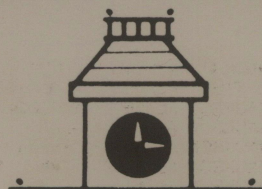

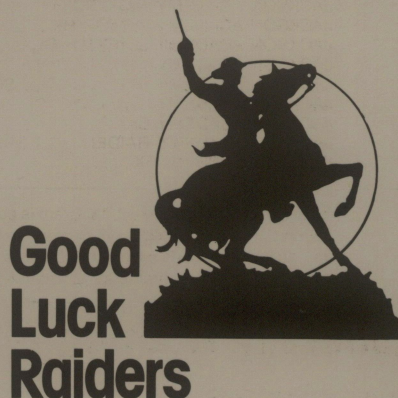

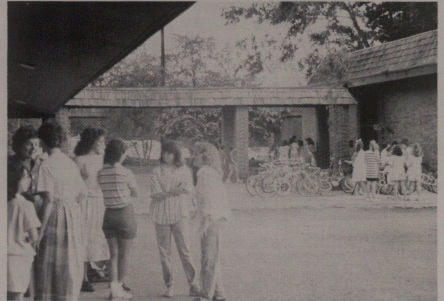
On August 19, 1988, Jackson Academy will begin its 30th year of providing quality education to young people in our community. When it was established in 1959 to offer instruction in the phonetic approach to reading and independent study skills, Jackson Academy had forty students enrolled and a staff of six.

Today the school offers a full program for students in a pre-primer through high school. The enrollment of 1350 is served by a dedicated and capable staff of 110. Both physical facilities and the academic curriculum reflect this growth and development.

In response to academic and extra-curricular demands, a progressive building program continues. This year's improvements include the addition of eleven new elementary classrooms, renovation of certain existing classrooms, enlargement of both the school cafeteria and elementary library, which includes an audio visual room and the establishment of a permanent elementary computer lab.

The primary concern of Jackson Academy's Board of Trustees and Administration is to provide for the diverse interests and goals of all the students.

Jackson Academy's academic strength lies in systematic, thorough instruction in basic skills with supportive services, and enrichment programs. As the curriculum advances, greater diversification of subject matter is offered in the arts, sciences and in the development of professional skills. Our outstanding athletic program consists of football, basket-



ball, baseball, soccer, track, tennis, swimming and softball. Opportunities for team participation and individual achievement are highlighted with interscholastic competition.

Through the diligent and unselfish efforts of many people, the school has grown to include a thirty-eight acre campus serving over 1350 students with a staff of 110.



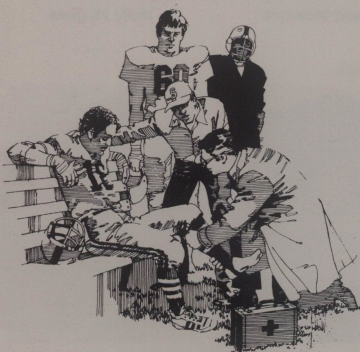
Junior High Cheerleaders

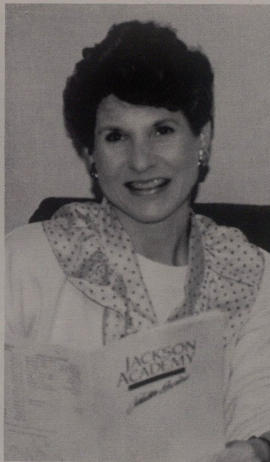
