The 1997-98 Accents look forward to yet another year of outstanding performances. With long hours of practice and teamwork, we hope to reach that goal.

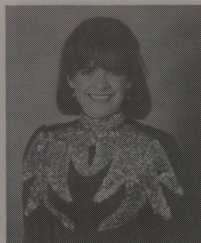
