





Both the Raiders and the Lady Raiders finished as state champions last year under his leadership. Coach Buffington came to JA after serving four years as Head Varsity Soccer Coach at Manchester Academy. In addition to coaching at JA, he has coached Mississippi Rush Soccer for the past seven years. Coach Buffington holds a US Soccer C license as well as a USC Advanced National Coaching diploma. In 2009, he signed a contract with the Harrisburg City Islanders,- later Penn FCa member of the USL professional soccer league. He was named National Men's Assistant Coach of the Year by the U.S. Track & Field and Cross Country Coaches Association (USTFCCCA) for both the 2016 and 2017 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Division I Outdoor Track & Field seasons. During his tenure at Hinds, the program saw a remarkable amount of success, including five individual national championships and one National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) record in jumps. Since 2016, he has coached five NJCAA national champions and four NJCAA national runners up in jumping events. He has coached athletes such as Breanna Brown-Marshall, who holds the school record for indoor and outdoor high jump, and Milton Harrell, who holds an NJCAA Record in jumping events. Coach Calvin won the Mississippi Gatorade Track and Field Athlete of the Year Award as a senior at Greenville Weston High School after winning state championships in both the high jump and long jump in 2009. He currently lives in Jackson with his wife, Helena.

MELISSA DENSON

HEAD VOLLEYBALL COACH

Coach Melissa Denson is beginning her seventh year at Jackson Academy. A native of Clinton, Mississippi, she attended and graduated from Clinton High School in 2007. She graduated from Mississippi College in 2012 where she was a member of the Lady Choctaw Volleyball Team. Following her undergraduate degree, she obtained her master's degree in secondary education. She served as an assistant coach and head coach at Clinton High School for seven years. In 2014, she was named CHS Teacher of the Year. In 2018, Coach Denson led the Lady Raiders to the state championship, where they finished runner-up. In 2019, she coached the Lady Raiders to a state championship and the winningest season in school history (43-3). She was named 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023 MAIS Coach of the Year, 2019 Clarion-Ledger Coach of the Year, and 2022 AVCA Region 4 High School Coach of the Year. She also led the Raiders to a MAIS state championship in 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023- the first 5-Peat in MAIS volleyball history. She has coached the Mississippi Volleyball Gatorade Player of the Year for the last five years (Parker Bracken, Lakin Laurendine, and Kaylee Lowther). As a head varsity coach, she tallied two hundred career wins as of 2022 and has an overall head coaching record of 261-68. Coach Denson also works for Infinity Volleyball Academy where she coaches and acts as the recruiting coordinator. She works in the JA upper school science department, where she teaches Biology II and Honors Human Anatomy and Physiology. She is married to her husband, Joshua.



COREY DICKERSON

HEAD VARSITY BASEBALL COACH

Coach Dickerson is entering his first year with the Raider Baseball program. He recently finished an eleven-year Major League Baseball career. Coach Dickerson graduated from Brookhaven Academy and attended Meridian Community College. The Colorado Rockies selected him in the eighth round of the 2010 Major League Baseball draft, and he made his MLB debut in 2013. He was elected an MLB All-Star in 2017 while playing for Tampa Bay.
